# Friday, September 6<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 a.m. Beach and Estuary Walk

Program is free with paid park entry

Join a park ranger for a leisurely hike along the beach and estuary shorelines of Lovers Key. Discover the natural beauty of both ecosystems as you encounter the seashells, crustaceans, birds, and other creatures that reside amongst these waterways. # Saturday, September 7<sup>th</sup> at 10 a.m. Beach Cleanup
